Our dynamic curriculum covers problem-solving, critical thinking and the development of skills and values so that learners take responsibility for own learning. Both individual and group work are assessed.

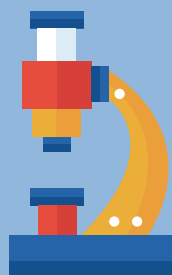
Woodhill College produces a community of teenagers who know how to think innovatively, express their ideas and take charge of their own lives.

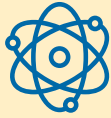

Once the learner has been accepted, the application will be captured, at which time an account code will be generated. The account holder will then receive an invoice for the once-off non-refundable enrolment fee as well as the welcome letter.

STEP 5:

Once the enrolment fee is paid and receipted the learner is officially enrolled.
