1. AWARDS CEREMONY POLICY

Grade 12 Valediction

- The Grade 12 Valediction Ceremony will take place after the Journey's End.
- This event is compulsory for all learners.
- All Grade 12 parents will be invited to attend.
- Every Grade 12 learner is acknowledged and celebrated.
- At the end of the Ceremony the new office bearers for the following year will be announced. Head Prefects will only be announced at the Academic Awards Ceremony in January.

Prefect's Induction

- Prefect's Induction will take place during a Formal Assembly with the entire High School present.
- All Prefect's parents will be invited to attend.

Extra-Mural Awards Ceremony

- The Extra-Mural Awards Ceremony will take place on a specified morning at the end of the year.
- All sports and cultural honours will be awarded at this ceremony.
- This event is compulsory for all learners.
- All Inter-House awards will be included at this ceremony.
- A guest speaker may be invited. The guest speaker may be a past pupil of Curro Klerksdorp or a prominent figure in society.

Academic Awards Ceremony

- This event will take place in January and is by invitation only.
- Parents of prefects will have the option to attend.
- A guest speaker may be invited. The guest speaker may be a past pupil of Curro Klerksdorp or a prominent figure in society.
- At the end of the Ceremony the Head Prefects will be announced.
- Merit awards obtained in terms 1 - 3 will be included with these awards.

2. ACADEMIC AND SPECIAL AWARDS RECOGNITION POLICY

Learners with an average of 80% and above are rewarded in the following manner; irrespective of current academic year:

- 1st Year of achievement: Badge
- 2nd Year of achievement: Rounded Scroll
- 3rd Year of achievement: Winged Scroll

Merit Certificates are awarded in Grades 8 and 9 for an average of 75% and above and in Grades 10, 11 and 12 for 70% and above.

Matric learners will receive a certificate based on personal performance.

The top 3 learners per grade will receive recognition.

Gr 8 to 11 learners will be recognised as best in subject provided they achieve 80% and above.

Academic Honours will only be awarded from Grade 10 to learners who are awarded a Winged Scroll for academic achievement.

New learners coming into the school; their previous academic records will be considered (DOE/IEB) comparable to an IEB standard of education.

Please take note: *In the event of a learner doing more than 7 subjects, the best 7 subjects will be taken into consideration when determining the promotion average for recognition purposes. This is in line with the procedure followed for calculating APS scores at university. The following subjects will form part of the 7 subjects as they are compulsory: Two languages, Mathematics or Mathematical Literacy and Life Orientation.*

MERIT CERTIFICATES FOR CONSISTENT HARD WORK:

This award recognizes those learners who work diligently throughout the year, but do not necessarily obtain the highest academic results. Please take note that every single educator has to agree to this award

EXPO

In the event of a learner going through to the regional round of an expo, the learner will qualify for a badge. If the learner qualifies to represent the school at national level, then the learner qualifies for a rounded academic scroll. If the learner continues to represent South Africa at the International Expo competition, the learner will qualify for a winged scroll. This event does not qualify a learner to receive Academic Honours.

OLYMPIADS

In the event of a learner entering an academic/subject Olympiad as organised by the school the learner will receive a certificate from the organising body. If a learner proceeds to the next round and finishes as one of the Top 5 learners in the province the learner will qualify for a rounded Academic scroll. In the event of a learner finishing in the Top 10 nationally, the learner will qualify for a winged Academic scroll (excluding General Knowledge Olympiad). This event does not qualify a learner to receive Academic Honours.

THE VICKY PATTISON-BACON DILIGENCE TROPHY

This trophy is awarded in memory of Vicky, to a Grade 10 learner who has not received an academic Merit Certificate but whom we wish to recognize for applying himself or herself diligently to his or her school work throughout the year.

THE NICHOLAS STEPHENSON TROPHY

Originated: 2015/10/05 RJVR/sf

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This award is in memory of Nicholas Stephenson who was a Grade 8 learner at our school when he passed away tragically. To remind us of his wonderful qualities, this trophy is presented to a Grade 8 learner who best fulfils the following criteria:

1. Has achieved an academic average of 75% or above
2. Has received recognition on the sports field
3. Is a role model for his/her fellow learners

BROTHER MATTHEW AWARD

This award is in memory of Brother Matthew who exuded an extraordinary zest for life. It is awarded to a Grade 12 learner.

This award is awarded to a learner who resembles the following qualities: He/She

- accepted challenges, not restricting his activities to what was easy
- liked to talk
- had a sense of humour
- was sociable, intense and helpful
- had a deep faith
- obeyed God's will
- was self-effacing
- was truthful

BEST ACHIEVER PER SUBJECT TROPHY

The top learner in every learning area will receive a floating trophy which will be awarded at the Matric Valedictory Academic Ceremony.

THE DANIE VAN RENSBURG SHIELD

The Danie van Rensburg Shield is awarded to the matric learner who has been recognized for his or her outstanding qualities: These are some of the criteria used for this award:

Loyalty to the school

Is a role model to others

Abides by the code of conduct

Has strong moral fibre and integrity

Is a good ambassador for the school

Treats staff and learners with respect

Is conscientious, but not necessarily a high achiever

Shows maturity in handling a crisis

Can be assertive and can engineer a win-win situation

Has some leadership qualities

LEADERSHIP

Leadership honours/colours are awarded to the Head Boy and Head Girl.

Certificates will be awarded to LRC members.

MATHEMATICS & NATURAL SCIENCE TROPHY

This is awarded to the top learners in Grade 8 and 9 with a combined Maths and Science mark.

DUX SCHOLAR Grade 10 & 11

This is awarded to the top Grade 10 and 11 learner based on promotion averages at the end of the 4th term. This award cannot be shared even if the difference has to be determined on decimals.

DUX SCHOLAR Grade 12

This is awarded to the top Grade 12 learner based on promotion averages at the end of the 4th term. This award cannot be shared even if the difference has to be determined on decimals.

DEUS CARITAS EST TROPHY

This is awarded to a learner who has received honours in three different fields, i.e. academic, sport, culture and/or leadership.

SPECIAL HONOURS AWARD – WHITE BLAZER

This accolade honours those learners who have excelled in at least three different disciplines. This means that honours needed to have been awarded in these. This is the highest award that a learner at Curro Klerksdorp may receive.

Any outstanding achievement not mentioned in this document will be dealt with on merit.

3. CULTURAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS RECOGNITION POLICY

Introduction

School awards are monitored in the following ways: commitment, attendance and conduct. An attendance register is kept and controlled by every coach or manager. It is important that every learner remains committed to the activity he/she chooses. This develops self-discipline and team spirit; therefore, if a learner does not have at least 80% attendance in the activity; he/she will not be eligible for an award.

It is paramount that participation be encouraged in all school-based cultural activities. It is for this reason that attendance at cultural events will be recognized in the “Merit Badge” system. Cultural achievement awards are monitored in the following ways: commitment, achievement and conduct. An attendance register will be kept by every manager of a cultural activity together with reports on any misbehaviour; conduct that is unbecoming or brings the school’s name into disrepute. All points (for merit and achievement) will be declared null and void should the learner be guilty of serious misconduct.

The Executive members of the school may at any point deem any honour already awarded null and void should a learner’s behaviour not adhere to the Code of Conduct as set out in the relevant school policy documentation.

The cultural portfolio would like to recognise external achievements as well, but to do so, **a certified copy of all external achievements together with a results sheet should to be handed in to the Head of Culture throughout the year.** The external achievements will be recognized by the **Cultural Anchor awards.**

The cultural recognition of achievement policy is a point-based system.

School Based Activities

Cultural Certificates and Scrolls (school related activities)

Points may be accrued from Cultural Prize-Giving to consecutive Cultural Prize-Giving, but cannot be accrued for a period longer than a year. Accumulation of points will result in the following forms of recognition. The highest award that can be awarded a learner is a Cultural Honours Blazer.

Should any other activities be offered by the school and are not represented on the points system, a special merit committee meeting will take place to determine the points that will be allocated. This meeting will take place before the Award Ceremony. Any points allocated will be made available on request.

Should a scroll be awarded then it may be purchased from the front office with an official letter which will be handed to the learner at the Awards Ceremony.

Cultural Honours Blazer

Only learners in Grade 10 to 12 may be awarded a Cultural Honours Blazer. To be awarded this honour, the learner must display true Curro spirit in behaviour and conduct. Honours blazers will be awarded to learners who obtain a winged scroll in culture.

External Activities

External activities will be recognized by the Anchor Awards. The award will be in the form of a pin that is to be worn on the blazer of the learner. The highest recognition that can be presented to a learner for an external achievement is the Golden Anchor Award.

Should any other activities take place that are not represented on the points system, a special merit committee meeting will take to determine the amount of points that will be awarded. The school will 1st research the competition/ activity in detail before reaching a decision as to if points will be awarded and the number of points that will be awarded.

A Golden Anchor Award Badge will be awarded to a learner who has represented his/her country in an international competition.

Should a Cultural Badge be awarded then it may be purchased from the front office with an official letter which will be handed to the learner at the Awards Ceremony.

A) Exceptions and Limitations

- Unfortunately, no previous recognition gained in any other school may be carried over to gain points within our school.
- Policy may be revised on a regular basis as the need arises or as determined by the Cultural Head and SMT of the High School.

4. MERIT AWARD POLICY

It is vital for the school to encourage learners to participate in extra-mural activities and be part of the school life at Curro Klerksdorp. In order for us to reach this goal, the merit system will not only encourage but also reward learners for their participation and not for their individual excellence. The normal Sport and Cultural Honours Policy will still recognise individual and team excellence. Learners will be awarded merit points on a very broad basis for participating, practising, playing, and auditioning for all the different activities.

The merit points will be recorded on the school administrative system and a detailed record of points accumulated can be printed at the end of each year. This will also serve a purpose when a learner requires a letter of reference. The merit points will also accumulate through the learner's school career. The merit points will be taken into account when Prefects are selected and forms part of the selection criteria. (Please refer to the Prefect Selection Policy.)

Learners will receive points according to each activity. The number of points differ according to the different activities and time spent taking part in the activities. To receive the maximum number of points a learner must be at 80% of the practises and 80% of the matches. Fewer points will be allocated to 50%-80% attendance. Staff and coaches involved with all the activities will keep register of all practises and events.

Top Ten merit learners per grade will be announced at the end of each term/beginning of the next term. Top Ten Badges will be awarded.

Learners who have achieved within the Top Ten for all the terms will be eligible for a Merit Badge. **This badge does not make the recipient eligible for any Honours Award or White Blazer.**

The Badges will be awarded as follows:

1st Year – Blue Badge

2nd Year – Silver Badge

3rd Year – Gold Badge

5. PREFECT SELECTION POLICY – HIGH SCHOOL

The following procedure will be implemented:

- 1) Grade 11 learners will attend a compulsory Leadership Identification Programme during the third term. All grade 11 learners must attend this camp as vital information will be discussed and the group needs to put strategies in place for their grade 12 year. Valuable life skills will also be learnt at camp and will assist in future years to come. If a learner cannot attend the camp, written motivation needs to be provided to the Head of High School.
- 2) During the camp the Grade 11 learners will have the opportunity to vote three times. The motivation behind the votes change during camp as the programme commences. After the camp only the Grade 10 and 12 learners and educators will have the opportunity to vote. The educators' votes will count the same ratio as the grade 11 votes.
- 3) Learners on final warnings will not be considered for any leadership roles.
- 4) The learners' disciplinary record will be considered and the Senior Management Team will consider any serious misdemeanours from the past.
- 5) The Merit points obtained since grade 8 will count towards the final mark obtained by the grade 11 learner.
- 6) Scores will be tallied and converted to a percentage. The breakdown consists of the following.

- 7) Grade 11 learners will have the opportunity to function as “seniors” during the preliminary exams. During this time they will have to do duties and will be evaluated by the staff.
- 8) Prefects will be announced at the Grade 12 Valedictory Awards Ceremony. Head Prefects will only be announced at the Academic Awards Ceremony held in January, once the prefects have attended the Prefects Planning Camp. A separate vote will be held for selection of the Head Prefects.
- 9) The Prefect Induction Ceremony will be held at school during morning assembly. Parents and Prefects will sign the Prefect's code.
- 10) Elected Prefects are awarded honours and blazers are worn with blue and white braiding as well as silver cord (The prefect honours does not make them eligible for a white blazer). The Head Boy and Head Girl are awarded special Leadership Honours making them eligible for a White Blazer.
- 11) The number of prefects appointed could comprise a maximum of 25% of the Grade 11 learner body.
- 12) Portfolios will be assigned to prefects.
- 13) The prefects must uphold the school's name at all times; do their duties; guide, direct and discipline; set an example to the learners at all times; aid the staff wherever possible.
- 14) Any serious misconduct will result in demotion as stipulated in the contract signed. A Prefect Point system has been established. A total of 20 points has been allocated to each prefect. For academic or behavioural misconduct points will be deducted. The number of points is determined by the Head of High School. Once the 20 points are at 0, the honour of being a school prefect will be revoked.
- 15) The final decision of the prefect body and executive prefects will remain with the Executive Head and the Head of High School.

6. HIGH SCHOOL POLICY REGARDING SPORTS RECOGNITION

A. INTRODUCTION

School awards are monitored in the following ways: commitment, attendance and conduct. An attendance register is kept and controlled by every coach or manager. It is important that every learner remains committed to the activity he/she chooses. This develops self-discipline and team spirit; therefore, if a learner does not have at least 80% attendance in the activity; he/she will not be eligible for an award. A learner will be marked present if he/she is not at practice due to his/her commitment to another school sport.

The Head of High School has the right after thorough investigation to make any honour null and void should a learner's behaviour and conduct bring the school's name in disrepute in any way.

Learners may only qualify for the highest achievement in a specific sport each year.

Scrolls and badges may be bought from the accounts office with a confirmation letter after the Sports Awards Ceremony.

SPORTS HONOURS:

- Only learners from grades **10 to 12** who have received a **winged scroll** for a recognised affiliated school sport (see above-mentioned list) may qualify. This award is only for individual excellence excluding team colours.
- To earn a Honours Blazer, the learner must display true Curro culture in a high standard of behaviour and conduct.
- The learner may purchase the honours braiding, honours pocket and winged scroll after the Sports Awards Ceremony with a confirmation letter.
- To afford Grade 12 learners the opportunity to wear their Honours blazers in their final school year, Grade 12 learners will be awarded their honours colours after participating at the relevant Inter-Provincial Tournaments, at a formal assembly.
- Under no circumstances will a learner be awarded a Honours blazer or even a scroll if he/she did not represent the Province at a National or Inter-Provincial Tournament.

Learners who participate in recognised affiliated school sports as per above list and comply with the rules regarding attendance and behaviour will receive a certificate at the Sports Awards Ceremony.

TEAM AWARDS:

School teams may qualify to win Team Colour Badges for outstanding achievement in any of the affiliated school sports leagues. Team Colour Awards will be awarded as follows:

- Blue award – Blue Sport Label Badge: Winners of Regional Leagues
- Silver award – Silver Sport Label Badge: Runners-up of North West League
- Gold award – Gold Sport Label Badge: Winners of North West League

These awards are not applicable to festivals and leagues for non-affiliated sports and are not eligible for sport honours as this is a team award.

Team awards will be awarded to any other special achievements at the discretion of the High School Senior Management Team.

Teams may only qualify for the achievement in a specific league each year.

Teams may however qualify for more than one scroll in a specific sport code each year if playing different leagues.

A Gold Team Award will **NOT** result in Sports Honours being awarded.

C. **EXTERNAL ACTIVITIES:**

Curro Klerksdorp would also like to recognise learners who excel in sporting activities **NOT OFFERED** at school as follows:

- If a learner participates for a Provincial B Team, the learner qualifies for a blue certificate and a blue anchor badge.
- If a learner participates for a Provincial A Team, the learner qualifies for a silver certificate and a silver anchor badge.
- In the event of excellent achievement e.g. winning a gold medal at a South African National Tournament, the learner will qualify for a gold certificate and a gold anchor badge.
- If a learner represents our country on an International level, the learner qualifies for a gold certificate and a gold anchor badge.

A signed letter on an original letterhead from the President of the discipline must be submitted to the Head of Sport before a learner will receive any awards.

Learners may only qualify for the highest anchor badge in a specific sport each year.

Anchor badges may be bought after the Sports Awards Ceremony from the accounts office with a confirmation letter.

D. **SPORTSMAN/WOMAN OF THE YEAR:**

This trophy can only be awarded to a senior learner (Grade 10–Grade 12).

Only in exceptional circumstances does the Head of High School have the right to overrule this stipulation.

- **RECOGNISED AFFILIATED SCHOOL SPORTS:**
Sportsmanship and attendance will be judged by coaches/managers in collaboration with the Head of High School and Head of Sport for High School.

Points will be awarded out of 10 for sportsmanship and attendance in all **recognised affiliated school** sports as listed in section B in this policy.

F. SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD – CULTURE/SPORT:

This floating trophy will be awarded to a learner who has shown outstanding sportsmanship at either a sporting event or a cultural event.
