

Our boarders are supervised by on-site boarding parents who provide comfort and supervision to our learners while they are away from home. Boarding parents provide personal attention to each learner and monitor homework and study periods.



Frequently asked questions

Where is the nearest medical facility?

Shelly Beach Hospital, Port Shepstone Provincial Hospital and Hibiscus Private Hospital are all just 10 minutes away.

How do leave arrangements and visits work?

Parents contact the boarder parents directly in order to arrange leave/visitations. If anybody else is collecting a child, written consent from a parent or guardian is required. We encourage parents and families to support their children in various activities at school. CemAir has daily flights between Margate Airport and OR Tambo.

Is theft an issue and how is it dealt with?

We do provide the necessary measures and structures to ensure the safekeeping of personal and valuable items. In the event of a theft occurring, the incident is dealt with immediately and effectively.

Who monitors my child's progress?

Creston College staff monitor academic progress and the boarding parents will monitor homework, study periods and the emotional well-being of the learners.

Will my child make friends easily?

We encourage learners to interact with one another and learners quickly bond and form close, life-long friendships.

Do boys and girls have separate facilities?

Yes, boarders are accommodated in separate facilities that include their bedrooms, ablutions and study areas. Boarders do, however dine together. As a co-ed school we encourage a healthy and positive interaction between boys and girls.

What is your response to bullying?

Bullying is not tolerated and is taken very seriously and will be dealt with by the boarder parents.

What happens if my child is homesick?

Our aim is to help every learner feel safe, secure and at home. A caring network of staff and learner support enables boarders to settle in to their new environment.

How do boarders occupy themselves over weekends?


We have regular sporting fixtures over weekends and learners can utilise the school facilities. Transport to and from church, the beach and other organised activities will be catered for.

What kind of food is served to the boarders?

A well-balanced diet prepared by the catering staff includes breakfast, lunch and dinner (with tea/coffee/juice). Takeaway lunch can also be arranged should learners take part in extramural activities.

How do parents communicate with their child?

Learners are allowed cellphones and they can communicate with their parents during free time. If a learner does not have a cellphone, parents can call or email the boarding school to communicate with staff and their children.
