Learner additional development (LAD)


This lesson was timetabled into Grade 4 to 7 timetables to provide learners with additional time to focus on key areas such as English, Afrikaans/isiZulu, Mathematics and Natural Sciences. During these lessons, learners will be engaged in activities which bridge any 'gaps' or address areas of weakness or concern within the relevant subject. This is not a homework session, nor will this be homework based. It is time for learners to work on their own, to re-cap basic core skills and/or be extended within the curriculum. Teachers will provide tasks on a weekly basis, as per the LAD Timetable, which learners should have stuck in their Communication Books.



The CASS/PBL lessons

The aim of this lesson is to assist learners in completing continuous assessments, class assessments and any Project-Based-Learning activities during the school day. Project based learning tasks often occur within a group and this time then offers learners ample opportunity to meet and discuss project ideas, instead of taking out afternoons after school and/or weekend time.

The CASS/PBL lesson further affords educators who teach numerous grades and subjects, to assess all classes on one day, despite not "seeing" a particular class on the date of the assessment for their subject lesson. This enables all classes to complete an assessment at the same time. These tasks will be listed on the Assessment Roster and educators will provide learners with any further details prior to the CASS/PBL lesson.



Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM)

(Grade 5 & 6 only)

These lessons focus on 21st Century Learning and integrate the basic skills of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. STEM encourages problem solving, creative and critical thinking and allows learners to actively and practically problem solve. We are excited to get started on this new program and know that the learners will have a lot of fun, while learning.

Safety and Security on the campus:

Kindly note the following measures that have been and are currently in place, to keep your child safe at school during collection times:

- After school, learners are accompanied by their teachers to both Taurus and Puttick Gates.
- Should parents, guardians and transport companies not arrive on time, learners are brought to the Primary School to telephone parents and guardians to notify them that they are waiting to be collected.
- For learners that wait for older siblings and extra murals, there is a supervised waiting area outside the Primary School Office.
- Should learners who attend an extra mural that is completed at 4:00pm not be collected, they will be taken to Aftercare which is the next supervised area of the school. Parents and guardians will be billed for this service.
- At NO time will a learner be left alone at the Taurus or Puttick Gates, hence the school must be informed of your child's collection, should arrangements change.
- Should there be an emergency, please contact your child's tutor teacher or Ms Anneline Naidoo in the Primary School Office on 087 087 0355
- Should your child be collected by an uber, let your child's tutor teacher know with a screen shot of the uber driver's details. Alternatively, the details sent to your child's phone will also suffice.
- Your support and understanding in ensuring that your child is collected timeously is imperative.
