

Curro Aurora - Dress and Appearance Guidelines (all learners)

Hair	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hair must be clean and neat at all times without impairing clear sight. • Hair styles may not attract unnecessary attention. • Braids and dreads are allowed in natural hair colour that matches own natural hair colour. • Long hair/braids must always be tied up neatly and be out of the face when in school uniform of any form. • Hair accessories/clips/Alice bands must be black, brown, white or dark blue • Small beads are allowed in braids – must be black, brown, blue or see-through(clear). • No items/accessories that can be categorized as “fashion items” will be allowed. • Undercuts are allowed, however, with no patterns. • No slit in the eyebrows are allowed. • No other zigzags or shaved-in patterns allowed. • No facial hair allowed unless permission for medical or religious reasons as granted by school management. Jewelry	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One small stud or ring (gold or silver) per ear. • Earrings to be worn in bottom piercing (in case the learner has more than one piercing). • One small gold/silver ring on either the left or right hand allowed. • No other jewelry allowed. • Items with religious significance/value will be allowed. Permission to be granted by school management after written motivation was submitted.
Nails	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nails must be of a suitable length and kept clean and neat. • No coloured nails allowed.
Socks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No “funky” or coloured socks allowed. • Navy blue school socks only.
School Uniform	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Neat and considerate of the educational environment. • No “non-school” garments allowed. • Please see “Curro Dress Code” on the Curro Website for more details.
